BUSI 597 Sustainable Finance (Pre-req BUSI 408) MW 8 AM

This introductory course explores how finance interacts with sustainability issues and its leading role in such transition. We will cover key economic and financial concepts and develop relevant knowledge and critical thinking on topics such as: Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) investing; the financing of sustainable projects; real and financial implications of climate risk.

BUSI 589H. Fixed Income. (Pre-req BUSI 408) TTH 8 AM

This is an introductory course in fixed income. The first part of the course covers basics on traditional fixed income instruments and derivatives, bond valuation, and interest rate risk management, with a focus on concepts, quantitative tools, and real-world applications. The second part covers various topics including mortgage markets, corporate bonds, sovereign debt, and monetary policy.
