ECON Study Abroad Opportunities

The UNC Economics Department is offering three (3!) different study abroad opportunities in Sweden and Croatia in Summer 2024, and we will be hosting information sessions both on zoom and in person before the **application deadline of January 31** if you are interested in learning more about these programs from the program directors and past participants.

All of these programs earn **EE or High Impact Experience credit in the general education curriculum. All program are also listed as **affordable summer programs** with billable costs equal to \$4700-\$6100/ program, which works out to \$1220-\$1785/wk or \$1016-\$1785/credit hour, which is a steal considering that summer school at UNC costs \$667-1000/credit hour and does not include lodging or cultural experiences!**

The first program is <u>UNC Exploring Economies in Scandinavia</u>. This is a 3-week program (June 16-July 5) in Stockholm for both Econ majors and non-Econ majors taught by me (Dr. Staub). You will get 3 hours of UNC graded credit (Econ362), the Global Understanding and Engagement GenEd, and amazing memories. This will be my fourth summer running this program and it is consistently my favorite part of every year! This year, students will have the flexibility to take only my 3-week course or to make it a 6-week program by taking another class in Stockholm or Copenhagen before or after Econ 362.

The next program is a re-vamping of <u>UNC Economics in Croatia</u>, which has been led in the past by Dr. Balaban and will now be led by Dr. Sheran-Andrews (aka MSA). This will be a 5-week program (June 24-July 26) in Split, Croatia for Econ Majors only. Students will receive 3 graded, UNC credits (Econ 415: Market Failures taught by MSA) and 3 transfer credits (Econ4--: Transport Economics taught by a professor from the University of Split); all 6 credits will count towards the Econ major.

Finally, we will offer a new 3-week program (July 8-July 26), <u>UNC Economics of Wine on the Dalmatian Coast</u>, in Split, Croatia. Students will take Econ490: The Economics of Wine with Dr. Staub and get 3 hours of graded, UNC credit that will count towards the Econ major. This program is also for Econ majors only. If you want to, you could pair this program with Exploring Economies in Scandinavia or another study abroad course that ends before 7/7.

Both programs in Croatia are timed such that you can take classes during Maymester or Summer I on campus.

Applications for Service-Learning Internships for the summer semester are now open! They should be completed on the Carolina Center for Public Service portal and are due January 31st.
