As interns, students will participate in environmental advocacy, work with volunteers and local organizations, and more.

Issue:

Global warming is the most crucial challenge facing our country and the world. Carbon dioxide emissions are the highest they've been in 4 million years and we're already feeling the impacts. 2020 tied for the hottest year on record globally. Extreme weather events including drought, wildfires, heat waves, hurricanes, and flooding are getting worse and happening more frequently. The urgency to act on climate change only grows each year.

We have two goals this spring.

- First, we are asking federal leaders to continue to move as quickly and boldly as possible to achieve the goal of net zero carbon pollution by 2050 and negative emissions thereafter.
 Last year, two significant pieces of legislation were passed to address this problem.
 Between the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill (BIF) and the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), the federal government has invested more than half a trillion dollars in climate solutions in the last year. These bills will bolster the work already underway in the states and make bigger, bolder commitments possible. Our goal is to support the ongoing funding of programs like these and call for additional strong regulations to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- Our second goal is to educate individual students, community members, and local institutions about existing programs they can take advantage of to increase energy efficiency, take advantage of clean energy subsidies, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

The Work:

Interns will lead and assist with the full range of campaign tasks, such as volunteer recruitment and management, coalition building, grassroots tactics, media outreach, social media work, and event planning and execution. Good verbal and written communication skills are important as interns will be leaders on the team. Applicants should be willing to devote at least 10 hours per week to campaign work, but schedules can be adjusted to accommodate class, work, and other

personal limitations. No previous experience or campaign work is necessary -- just a willingness to learn and a passion for the issues at hand!

Location: North Carolina

<u>Term</u>: We are looking to hire interns immediately to work through December 2023, with opportunities to extend.
